
to enjoy seeing different styles 'through the decades'!





### **Village Hall Improvement Project**

Following our successful planning application, we are now going through the Building Regulation application process – this is likely to take another 4-6 weeks. Once granted, the building regulations will detail the technical standards set down by the Government to make sure all improvement work is carried out to reasonable standards, covering areas such as fire safety, energy consumption and accessibility.



In the meantime, we are obtaining quotes for the work and continuing with funding applications. Post Covid, funding opportunities are sadly less numerous and competition to be awarded the funding is fierce. However, new funding windows are regularly opening up and with planning in place & building regulations soon to be in place, we will be in the best position for our funding applications to succeed.



### Annual Parish Council meeting 14<sup>th</sup> May 204



The Annual Parish Council meeting appointed Jane Storey as Chairman for another year. The council members co-opted Andy Sharkey to the council. Andy lives in New Road with his family. David Blundell stood down as the Village Hall rep and Roger Cross has taken his place. Andy Sharkey has been appointed Footpaths officer. ### Tostock Village Hall Lottery - 100 Club

Your chance to win up to £250 every 3 months in a village prize draw, whilst also raising vital community funds to improve our village hall.

To make our wish list of improvements to the village hall a reality, we will need to raise considerable funds. The intention is to raise as much of this money as possible through local and national grants, as well as working in close partnership with the Tostock Parish Council. However, alongside this, it is also vital for us to increase our community fundraising efforts and as part of this, we would like to share with you our exciting plans to set up a Tostock Village Hall Lottery -100 Club!

The Tostock Village Hall Lottery will have -

- Quarterly draws starting in September 2024 (followed by December, March & June);
- Entries fixed at £13 per quarter (equating to £1 per week);
- Six quarterly prize payments provided we can attract 100 entries, each quarter the lottery will pay
  out a first prize of £250, with further prizes of £150, £100, £75, £50 and £25. This means that half
  of the lottery money is given out in prize funds, with the other half going towards the village hall
  improvement project.
- PLEASE NOTE, until we can get 100 participants the above prize amounts will be reduced so that every draw we will still give six cash prizes which equate to 50% of the money taken in.

Entries will be open all year round, and when you join you will automatically be included from the next quarterly draw. The draw will be open primarily to Tostock residents (aged 16 years and over), however friends or family from outside the village who are over the age of 16 can also enter. You will also be able to have multiple participants from each house-hold, indeed you can request multiple entries in the same name.

The necessary administrative procedures, including the required local government licence, are currently being put in place to run this lottery. Once this is in hand, the Tostock Village Hall and Tostock Village Facebook pages will provide information on how to enter, as well as a leaflet drop to all houses.
